2017 Draft Priority List and Schedule

Statutory Directive for MFLs

Water management districts or DEP must establish MFLs that set...

"...the <u>limit</u> at which further <u>withdrawals</u> would be significantly harmful to the water resources or ecology of the area."

Section 373.042(1), Florida Statutes (F.S.)

2017 Draft Priority List and Schedule

Statutory Directive for Reservations

Water management districts or DEP may...

"...<u>reserve from use by permit</u>
<u>applicants</u>, water in such locations and
quantities, and for such seasons of the
year, as in its judgment may be required
for the protection of fish and wildlife or
the public health and safety.."

Section 373.223(4), Florida Statutes (F.S.)

Priority List and Schedule Meets Statutory and Rule Requirements

- It is based on the importance of waters to the State or region, and the existence of or potential for significant harm
- Waters experiencing or reasonably expected to experience adverse impacts are included
- Water bodies for which the district will voluntarily undertake independent scientific peer review are identified
- Proposed reservations are identified
- Listed water bodies that have the potential to be affected by withdrawals in an adjacent water management district are identified

2017 Draft Priority List and Schedule

- Required by statute to create annual priority list and schedule for DEP review and approval
- Priority Lists will be presented to respective District Governing Boards for approval
- Districts are seeking stakeholder input on the priority list and schedule



CFWI Area








SWFWMD Proposed Priority Water Bodies

- Supports solutions for CFWI water supply needs, consistent with other objectives




Kissimmee Reservation

Water will be reserved up to the proposed "Water Reservation stage"


Headwater Lakes & Kissimmee River
