Alternative Water Supply Projects Within the CFWI Receive State Funding

The State, in coordination with water management districts, has provided more than \$37.1 million in cost-share funding from the FY 2023-24 grant funding cycle for four alternative water supply projects within the Central Florida Water Initiative (CFWI) area.

These projects are anticipated to leverage more than \$124 million in cooperating entity matching funds. When these projects are fully online, they are anticipated to create more than 67.01 million gallons per day (mgd) and 18.71 million gallons in transmission/distribution capacity.

The projects include:

- Taylor Creek Reservoir St. Johns River Water Supply Project
- Polk Regional Water Cooperative Southeast Wellfield Implementation
- Toho Water Authority Cypress Lake Wellfield
- Town of Oakland Stormwater Harvesting near Lake Apopka
